Finance Committee

The Finance Committee would like to thank the Trinity members for your support for providing us with a successful stewardship campaign in 2017 that provided us with the ability to fully fund all requests from staff for programs, as well as to be able to provide several new program opportunities. Our 2017 / 2018 budget is \$1,638,000 and was approved at our June Charge Conference.

We also want to thank you for the support during the 2016/2017 fiscal year that just closed. This was an unusual year as we not only had the budget to work on, but we purchased the Rock Creek property as well. Your generosity was shown when we received almost \$170,000 of gifts as part of the \$150,000 match challenge. Because of this we were able to payout the related loans on this acquisition by the end of September 2016. In addition, during the fiscal year we received pledge receipts of just over \$1,422,000 and along with the refinance of our building loan and other cost savings we ended the year with a surplus of approximately \$59,000.

We appreciate your generosity in stepping up to assist when needed. When you look at our regular budget and the challenge campaign, you provided us with more than \$1,700,000 of funds to work with during the past year.

We look forward to another successful year of ministry in 2017/2018.

Minefee House

In the summer of 2014, Trinity entered into an agreement with Richmond Redevelopment and Housing Authority (RRHA) to restore a boarded up house at 1414 Minefee Street in the city of Richmond. Trinity was charged with supplying materials and labor for the restoration, and RRHA had the responsibility to secure a qualifying homeowner.

A leadership team consisting of Forrest White, Bruce Watson, Tracy Parrish, Mike Eunice, and Jack Berry directed the coordination of the renovation process. From the start, Trinity's volunteers made significant progress in addressing the challenges associated with this property. Once a basic cleanup had been completed, detailed work for the grounds and the interior/exterior of the house began. The goal was to restore the house completely: walls, ceilings, floors, crawl space, attic, electrical, plumbing, HVAC, painting, lighting, windows, and doors. By the summer of 2016, Trinity had positioned itself to have fully completed the house within two months.

However, despite this steady progress, RRHA because of federal regulations found it very difficult to secure a potential homeowner who could qualify. RRHA never gave up in their pursuit for an owner. Civic associations, neighborhood public schools, churches, and other non-profit housing organizations were all contacted during this search, and this included assorted media advertising designed to attract a buyer. Trinity offered search assistance as well, but we too could not qualify a potential owner.

Late in the spring of 2017, RRHA was granted federal approval to publically auction several vacant parcels of homes in the city. These homes had been empty and off Richmond's tax roster for years. The Minefee house was one of the homes in the auction listings. RRHA held the house for Trinity until the last attempt to secure an owner failed.

We want to acknowledge and thank everyone who gave of their time, energy, and effort to restore the Minefee house. It is normal to feel some disappointment that the house was not fully restored, but we can also find satisfaction in what we accomplished, and celebrate that the house was purchased and returned to the tax roster for the city.

Trinity Foundation Receives Gift from Suhor-Graham Foundation

The Trinity Foundation has received a generous gift of approximately \$315,000 from the Suhor-Graham Foundation (SGF), which was dissolved earlier this year. With this gift a Suhor-Graham Mission fund has been established to support future mission activities of our church.

SGF was founded by John "Stuart" Graham who was, along with his family, a long-time member of Trinity with funds from the estate of George L. Suhor, who was a close family friend. The Trinity Foundation was one of five organizations designated to receive support. Over the course of its 30-years of existence, SGF gave annual grants to the Trinity Foundation to be used to serve the less fortunate. In recent years the grants have helped fund the Micah Initiative in the Oak Grove-Bellemeade area of south Richmond. Trinity Foundation members, Ralph Roop and Larry Girvin served 18 years and 12 years respectively on the Board of SFG as representatives of the Trinity Foundation. Since SGF's inception, the Trinity Foundation has received nearly \$730,000 from SGF.

Trinity Foundation is so blessed to receive this most generous gift. This gift and all other gifts it receives enable the Foundation to support many significant church projects and outreach programs.


July in Review
