The Civil Air Patrol West Richmond Cadet Squadron

On March 23, 2017, the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) had their final meeting at Trinity after 32 years of meeting here every Thursday night! The West Richmond Cadet Squadron of the CAP presented Trinity with a Certificate of Appreciation.

CAP is a congressionally chartered, federally supported non-profit corporation that serves as the official civilian auxiliary of the United States Air Force. CAP is a volunteer organization that performs three congressionally assigned key missions: emergency services, which includes search and rescue (by air and ground) and disaster relief operations; aerospace education for youth and the general public; and cadet programs for teenage youth.

The Virginia Wing of the Civil Air Patrol (CAP) is the highest echelon of Civil Air Patrol in the state of Virginia. The Virginia Wing consists of over 1,800 cadet and adult members at over 24 locations across the state of Virginia. The West Richmond Cadet Squadron is one of the few Cadet Chartered Squadrons in the Virginia Wing of the CAP. To be considered a Cadet Squadron, a unit's membership must be made up of more cadets (youth members) than seniors (adult members). The West Richmond Cadet Squadron now meets at Waller Depot Armory, Headquarters of the Virginia Defense Force, on Waller Road Richmond.

UMCOR Kits for Annual Conference

Pastor Larry Lenow dedicated Trinity's 2017 UMCOR Kits during worship Sunday, June 11. Creating UMCOR Kits is one of many hands-on ministries of Trinity's UMW, but anyone in our congregation with a heart to serve can help make them. This year we sent 223 UMCOR Kits to Annual Conference: 91 School Kits and 132 Health Kits. We also sent \$382 to cover toothpaste and postage. UMCOR School Kits contain the required school supplies, without which children in developing countries are barred from attending school. The Trinity Stitchers generously supply beautiful handmade, doublehandled fabric bags to hold the school supplies. Health Kits contain basic health supplies and go to disaster areas world-wide. Debbie Schmitt is the contact person for UMCOR Kits. We collect completed UMCOR Kits in Mission Central closet.

UMFS Women's Auxiliary

The UMFS Women's Auxiliary sponsored their annual High Tea for 40 residential students at UMFS Sunday, June 4 in the Dining Room. Students learned Tea traditions from Sheelagh Davis of Reveille and enjoyed traditional refreshments of scones, tea sandwiches, and fruit. The Women's Auxiliary meets the third Thursday at 3900 West

Broad Street and includes representatives from 40 United Methodist Churches.
