Dear Friends at the Richmond District,

Greetings from the floor of General Conference!

Today is our last day of this two week gathering and I thought it might be helpful to offer a brief update for you. Many of you have been praying for all here and I cannot tell you how those prayers have sustained us and our church through these days. I believe that the prayers of April 10 and those before and after have been a premier part of God's agenda and the work of unity that has occurred here.

Human sexuality has been at the forefront of conversation. There has been animated debate and multiple acts of protests. In it all, the Conference elected to invite the Bishops to go to work and lead us forward. As a result, all decisions around human sexuality have been deferred to a special General Conference that the Bishops will potentially call in two or three years. There, all other issues would be set aside and the Conference would deal solely with this issue that has so divided us. It is fair to say that this act, though not without precedent, is close to it.

This is obviously more complex and there are multiple details, but it does mean that as of now, there is no change in our United Methodist Discipline. This is a source of frustration for some and relief for others. I believe however this is the result of your prayers. We will

leave this Conference a still united United Methodist Church. We will take some more time to deal with this so that prayerfully and deliberately we find a way forward.

In the midst of potential division, please join me as I seek the prayer and dream of Jesus in John 17, that we might be one. I will look forward to speaking more to this when I get back, but until then, please know that your prayers have mattered and do matter!

Updates From The Trustees

On Friday, May 6, 2016, our Trustees completed the closing on the property located at

7916 Rock Creek Road. The Trustees, Finance Committee, Trinity Foundation and Church Council worked collectively to secure this strategic piece of land. Negotiations started in October 2015 with the bank representing the estate. One legal hurdle for the estate was cleared in December, and at that point the offer from the Trustees was more carefully considered. In the end, diligence and a practical approach from the Trustees allowed the church to purchase the property for \$300,000. Ironically, this was the same price the Trustees offered the owner in 2008.

The purchase of this property gives Trinity more flexibility for future expansion. At this time, no definitive plans are on the table for discussion. Unfortunately, the interior/exterior conditions of the house do not merit any type of restoration. The Trustees are in the process of reviewing proposals for taking the house down. Thanks to everyone who was involved in this endeavor for your time, patience, and prayers.

Additionally, the Trustees are in the process of working with Jim Byerly, an architect from Huff Morris, who is conducting a review of Eaton Hall and our Nursery areas. Over the last few months, the Trustees have received information from our youth, Preschool staff, Boy Scouts, Civil Air Patrol, Yoga instructors, Bereavement team, and staff regarding the use of both areas. At this point, Mr. Byerly with assistance from the Trustees and Staff are meeting with stakeholders to pinpoint use patterns and needs with the goal of developing a working plan for making practical and aesthetic improvements.


