Pastor's Corner

A Sending Church

This Easter season we celebrate the glorious Resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. After his Resurrection and before his Ascension, Jesus sends the disciples out into the world to continue his ministry, giving them the Great Commission.

Last fall I attended the Goodson Preaching Academy, and my group's preaching mentor was Rev. Mochel Morris, who is the Pastor at Christ Crossman UMC in Falls Church. Mochel grew up here at Trinity. The Sunday after Christmas, Rev. Teresa McRoberts, Trinity's former Associate Pastor, visited Trinity with her family. Teresa had been a member of Trinity before answering the call to ministry. Rev. Doug Forrester, Lead Pastor at Reveille UMC; Rev. Kelley Lane, Minister of Adult Ministries at Reveille UMC; Rev. Beanie Kelly, Associate Pastor and Director of Children and Family Ministries at Shady Grove UMC (Short Pump); and Rev. Amy Grant, Associate Pastor at Fairfax UMC, all came from among Trinity's congregation as well. As many of you know, I grew up here at Trinity, and I owe much of my faith formation to our children's and youth ministries. Do you notice a pattern? Trinity is a church where people sense and answer God's call to ministry. Trinity is a sending church!

It has been an honor and a privilege to serve as your Associate Pastor since July 2012. You all have embraced me and encouraged me in my growth as a pastor. I am excited to announce that I have been deemed ready to take the next step in my ministry this summer. While I do not know the details of my new appointment at this time, it is likely that I will be appointed to a church as a solo pastor. Trinity has prepared me well for this big responsibility. I want to express my sincere appreciation to the Trinity family for your support during my four years here as Associate Pastor. I am grateful for the mentoring I have received from Rev. Dr. John Peters and Rev. Larry Lenow as well as the opportunity to serve with talented church staff and lay leaders. Greta and I are excited for what lies ahead, and we thank you for the love and care you have shown us. May God continue to bless your ministry!

2016 Lenten Easter Mission Offering

The 2016 Lenten Easter Mission Offering (LEMO), which began on Ash Wednesday, continues an annual tradition of Trinity. The LEMO funds Trinity's local, national, and international missions each year. The theme of this year's LEMO is Luke 4:18: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to bring good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim release to the captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free" (NRSV). The various ministries enabled and empowered by the LEMO continue Jesus' ministry to the very ones whom Jesus commands us to love, care for, and serve. We'll have a video about the LEMO in worship on Sunday, March 13, and a congregation-wide mailing as well. Last year's LEMO mission grant recipients will be in Connection Alley throughout Lent so that you can learn about how last year's LEMO made their ministries possible.

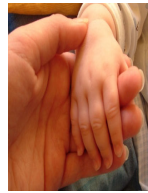


Kelly's Classic Casseroles!

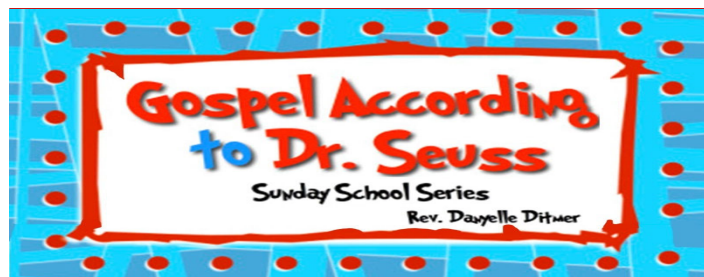
Imagine the smell of the bread baking and the sweet taste of fresh grapes.

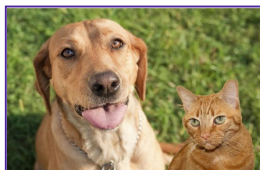

News from Trinity's Preschool

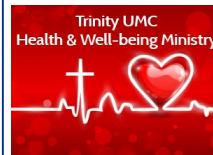
