
Ash Wednesday is a powerful and important day. It is the day that we enter into our Lenten disciplines. (This year at Trinity we have changed things a bit in an effort to avoid more repetition and add focus and intentionality. See the articles in this Window.) And on this day when we enter Lent we focus on our own mortality. You are dust and to dust you shall return. This is a statement of fact whether we like it or not – we are mortal. But this acknowledgment leads us to a greater truth – our need, our total dependence on Jesus Christ for true life, eternal life. Lent should lead us into a closer relationship with Christ.


The imposition of ashes (the ashes from the burnt palms of last year's Palm Sunday) is a striking and visible witness. Ash because we are dust. In the form of the cross because we depend on Christ. This year we will again observe Ash Wednesday with the imposition of ashes at services at **noon** and at **6:45 PM**. I hope that you will be able to be present.

This year we will be adding an additional opportunity. I am aware that some working folks are unable to be present for either service. I am also aware that for many more, they are able to be present for the later service, receive ashes and then return home and remove their ashes shortly thereafter. Our Ash Wednesday ashes are a silent, but powerful witness. With them we silently confess and proclaim that we are practicing Christians in a world where that can no longer be assumed (as if it ever could.) Therefore this year we are offering Ashes, Blessing and Coffee. It will be available at the drive-through in front of the Welcome Center steps 7:00-8:00 AM on Ash Wednesday, March 1. Drive up, receive your ashes, receive a blessing and we will get you a cup of coffee. This is another attempt to take the church into the world.

Whatever your observance may be I invite you to take Lent and your spiritual disciplines very seriously. It is in this way that we are able to participate in the depth of our Lord's Passion and the power of his Victory at Holy Week. I wish for you a meaningful and holy Lent.

#### Ash Wednesday Drive-By


Wear the ancient sign of your faith all day: between 7-8am on Ash Wednesday, March 1, drive by Trinity's front

#### 2017 Lenten Easter Mission Offering: Seeds of Resurrection

Gardeners, farmers, and any people of faith know this about winter: no matter how long the dark nights or how frozen the earth, it's never the end of the story.

Our faith story began in a garden in Genesis. It reached a breaking point in the garden of Gethsemane. It found new life in the garden of Easter resurrection. And it will conclude in the middle of the city, in a garden where the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

Though the 2017 Lenten Easter Mission Offering begins in winter, we know that we are planting seeds of resurrection for the seasons to come. Through your generosity, last year's Mission Offering brought \$34,000 to be planted in mission efforts from Forest Avenue to Africa, from Henrico to Haiti and Honduras, from Richmond to Eurasia. We celebrate the opportunity to give again through the 2017 Lenten Easter Mission Offering. In a wintry world, may our generosity be a source of faith and healing for the nations!

#### **World Day of Prayer**

Church Women United will celebrate World Day of Prayer at Fifth Baptist Church, 1415 W. Cary Street, at 10:30 AM Friday, March 3. World Day of Prayer comes to us from the Philippines with the title "Am I Being Unfair to You?" This topic explores concepts of economic justice both in the Philippines and around the world and our response in light of God's generosity. Read Matthew 20:1-16. Mary Hetzel spoke about her roots and the Micah Initiative at the February 3<sup>rd</sup> CWU meeting. The Micah Initiative, a ministry of Richmond Hill, is a vibrant network of 125 faith communities that mentor, tutor, and volunteer in each of the Richmond Public Elementary Schools so that every child believe, "I am valuable."

#### **Literacy Teams**

Trinity volunteers encourage our lowest performing students in grades K and 1 to learn to read through the weekly **Literacy Team Program** at Oak Grove. Title 1 Reading Teacher Jessica Carpenter and Communities in Schools Site Coordinator Mary Valenza supervise our work. Trinity's involvement at Oak Grove is continual, but then the needs are also continual. When you help a young child in school, you help the whole family. We are seeing great success with some of our students. The Micah Initiative is a ministry of presence and encouragement.

#### Denim Drive/Clothing Donations for Tuckahoe Middle School

(300 pounds of clothing yields a check of \$30 to the school.)
