Pastor's Corner

"It is too light a thing that you should be my servant to raise up the tribes of Jacob and to restore the survivors of Israel; I will give you as a light to the nations that my salvation may reach to the end of the earth." Isaiah 49:6

In this passage from the book of the prophet Isaiah God declares that the Messiah will be more than everyone expected, not merely the savior of Israel but indeed the savior of the world, a light to the nations that my salvation **may reach** to the end of the earth. Later Jesus makes clear that his charge is also our charge. "You are the light of the world." (Matt. 5:14) This is not complicated, but it is terribly significant.

I was so thrilled when our Stewardship Committee chose for the theme of our 2017 Campaign Extending our Reach. Such faith! Such vision! The challenge before us is to underwrite and support the church so that we can extend the reach of our ministries and of our love. It is a worthy goal. However, I must point out that it is not an original goal. Several centuries ago, a young Anglican priest by the name of John Wesley had the idea first. He was not content to preach to the few people who came to church so he went to the wheat fields and the coal mines where the people were. He was not satisfied with ministering only to the nobility who endowed the parish churches but was committed to addressing the needs of the hurting people. Our vision in nothing if not profoundly Methodist!

What, you may ask, does extending our reach mean at Trinity? I'm glad you asked. It means embracing our tradition. It means being who we are. Let me be clear: Trinity is a great church. We are doing great ministry. But our ministry is not great enough. In can never be great enough, not so long as there are people around us who do not know Jesus Christ, not as long as there remain hurting people in our community and our city, not as long as there is more that we can do to further the cause of Jesus Christ. God has given us a tremendous mission field right here in Richmond, let us prove worthy to the task. My brothers and sisters I invite you to join me in extending our reach all to the glory of God!

Camp Rainbow Connection (CRC): A Community of Caring for People with Intellectual Disabilities

Special guest speaker: *Reverend Mike Harrington*, Tuesday, February 14 10:15 AM in Mastin Room

Learn more about the week-long respite camp held for individuals with intellectual disabilities. CRC started in 1985 at Westview on the James and included 25 campers and 15 volunteers. Today, there are 120 campers age 16 to 80s with varied ability levels, heritages and faiths, with a staff of over 100 volunteers. Activities include Bible class, music, arts and crafts, games, dancing and more.

Rev. Harrington has been on the staff of CRC for the past 5 years.

Winter Weather Decisions

Making the decision to close our building based upon winter weather conditions can be a challenge.

First, the Trinity Preschool follows the Henrico County Public Schools closing decisions. If Henrico schools are closed or are on a delayed opening, then Trinity Preschool will follow the school system's plan.


For all church activities and for organizations that use the church facilities, generally, the decision to close the building will also follow the Henrico County Public Schools schedule.

However, our ability to re-open the building after a winter weather event depends upon how quickly we can clear our parking lots and sidewalks. If we can safely get people on to our grounds and into our building, then Trinity **might** return to normal operations quicker than the school system. As soon as the decision is made about opening/closing, we post it on our website, Facebook page, and update our phone system message.

Decisions related to closing the building on Saturdays and Sundays will be made based upon weather conditions at that time.
