Our children will entertain their parents with songs and will receive a visit from Santa. While we do not lead activities, we provided supervision, companionship, and compassion for our campers. Mentors are responsible for getting to and from camp and the \$20 background check. The 2018 application deadline is June 1. We also need drivers to pick up 2-3 campers and get them to and from camp, as not all children have transportation.
