Box Tops for Education Update

Thank you for your continuing support for the church's box tops for education campaign. This year the recipient is Tuckahoe Middle School. Since we started monitoring the number of box tops donated to the schools in late 2016, we have donated the following:



2016 UMFS Charterhouse School: 1,039 box tops at .10 each or \$103.90

2017 Oak Grove Bellmeade: 1,268 box tops at .10 each or \$126.80

January to March 12, 2018 Tuckahoe Middle School: 386 box tops at .10 each or \$38.60

This may seem so minimal in amount but each school can collect as much as the maximum of \$20,000 for their unbudgeted operational needs if we step up our campaign to help them with our share of box tops for education. It is easy to do. You only have to be conscientious about cutting them from the products that offer them and then drop them at the designated box in Mission Central at Trinity.

Can we count on you to help the designated school this year? Thank you for your generosity.
