Pastor's Corner

Dear Friends.

Acts 15:1-29 describes the Council of Jerusalem. It dealt with the first controversy facing the Church of Jesus Christ, to wit, whether one first had to become Jewish in order to become Christian. It could be called a question of inclusion. Did the Gentiles (Greeks) whom Paul and company were converting, baptizing and forming into churches need to follow the Law of Moses or not? Did the males need to be circumcised and all the converts follow the dietary and morality laws. These were not insignificant questions and given the controversy we may rightly assume that there were passionate arguments on both sides. But the Council of Jerusalem adopted a plan that brought the church together.


Alas, some things never change. Indeed, I am aware of no time in Christian history in during which the Church of Jesus Christ was not embroiled in controversy. This is less a sign of a lack of faith than it is the inevitable consequence of striving to follow Christ while living in this world.

The special session of General Conference met in St. Louis, Feb. 23-26. It rejected the compromise One Church Plan designed to bring the church together (or at least to allow each to follow their conscience.) Rather the Conference adopted the Traditional Plan. Its authors describe it as a plan of accountability; it includes measures of strict enforcement of our current policy. This is a difficult time for the UMC. There is much hurt and pain on the part of those being excluded, their families and loved ones. The controversy is far from over. I cannot tell you what the future will hold. But I do know who holds the future. Our only task is to faithful. We will be holding a General Conference Debrief this Sunday, March 3 at noon (after worship) in the Sanctuary. We will do our best to let you know what just happened.

What has not changed, what will never change is our call to follow Jesus Christ, to be centered on Jesus Christ and to love like Jesus Christ. See you Sunday.



At this time, our blood drives will be coordinated by the American Red Cross, and they have recommended that we move from quarterly donations to twice a year. Signing up will continue to be offered on-line, and walk-ins are always welcome. We look forward to seeing you on April 14 and October 20.



In a recent meeting, Trinity learned about the current status of the programs that CARITAS has in place to help the homeless in Richmond. By early 2020, the CARITAS leadership expects their traditional model of churches hosting families on church sites to a different model. This new model will bring church volunteers to housing sites designed specifically for CARITAS families. Meal preparation, providing toiletries, and small group activities will continue to be part of the CARITAS ministries for churches. This new template will offer better structure and stability for families. The Trinity congregation will have an opportunity to learn more about CARITAS and their offerings on Sunday, June 23.

Inclement Weather Policy

Winter Weather Decisions

Making the decision to close our building based upon winter weather conditions can be a challenge.

First, the Trinity Preschool follows the Henrico County Public Schools closing decisions. If Henrico schools are closed or are on a delayed opening, then Trinity Preschool will follow the school system's plan.

For all church activities and for organizations that use the church facilities, generally, the decision to close the building will also follow the Henrico County Public Schools schedule.

However, our ability to re-open the building after a winter weather event depends upon how quickly we can clear our parking lots and sidewalks. If we can safely get people on to our grounds and into our building, then Trinity **might** return to normal operations quicker than the school system. As soon as the decision is made about opening/closing, we post it on our website, Face Book page, and update our phone system message.

Decisions related to closing the building on Saturdays and Sundays will be made based upon weather conditions at that time. Questions contact Bill Pike bpike@trinityumc.net
