Acts 2 describes the Day of Pentecost; the outpouring of the Holy Spirit filled the gathered disciples giving them abilities they did not normally have. It made the church more than the sum of its parts. The Holy Spirit has been doing the same thing ever since.

I do not need to be reminded of the humanity of the church. The travails of our UMC, scandals marring other denominations and the mundane day-to-day struggles of the institution give constant and ample testimony to the truth that we are human, we are imperfect, we are broken and sinful. In every century and era, our shortcomings are on display for all to see. But still...

When one considers all the excesses (the Thirty Years War, the Spanish Inquisition, Puritans and Witch Trials, Prohibition, TV Evangelists, just to name a few) it is amazing – miraculous – that we have survived. The church remains human and fallible. But the Holy Spirit continues to fill gathered disciples. And it gives abilities we would believe that we have. And it makes us more than the sum of our parts. It gives us the ability to love, and to act.

Come watch on June 9, the Day of Pentecost at the 9:30 and 11:00 services, a group of young people have their first opportunity to make a public profession of their faith. The Holy Spirit will have at them (and at us?) Who knows what could happen? The church is of God, and God is still active. It's a beautiful thing.


Insights from both authors along with observations from those in attendance will help us answer the question: is Mayberry still relevant in our world today?
