Pastor's Corner

"Be still and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations, I am exalted in the earth." Psalm 46:10

Be still. That's rather an odd theme for Lent, don't you think? A little off, perhaps? That is why it's important. We need to be thrown off our usual pattern, knocked out of our predetermined path. Lent calls us to stop and reflect, to examine and confess, to be challenged. *Be Still and Know That I am God* is precisely what Lent invites us to do.

We begin, as we always do, with Ash Wednesday acknowledging our own need and mortality. Throughout the weeks of Lent we will be preaching on the Psalms. Psalms? Sounds rather dull and irrelevant, doesn't it? Does it though? The Psalms, these prayers of Israel, these songs of the heart, speak of the human condition. They speak of our human emotion. They speak of our very lives. This could get interesting...

During Lent we will see and hear an emphasis on opportunities to grow in faith and relationship, small groups and ways to connect. There is an invitation to daily devotion and prayer. These are simple things that have the potential to change our lives. Then too, there will be decisions to be made: The Stewardship Campaign, the Lenten Mission Offering, invitations to step up and serve.

Yes, there will be much going during these six weeks of Lent. But it all leads us to one place: Calvary and the Cross. The message is a simple one:

Be still and know that I am God.

Parking at Trinity

In any neighborhood, parking lots and side streets can be interesting for drivers, pedestrians, and bicycle rid-

ers. Here are some gentle reminders about our parking lots and side street parking.

First, always lock your vehicle, and do not leave valuable items in plain sight.

If you are parking in one of our lots, please make every effort to stay within the boundary lines of the space you are using. When leaving your parking space and exiting the lot, please make sure to check twice in all directions before backing out and exiting.

Our neighbors on Stuart Hall and Rock Creek roads have been good about tolerating us when we have an overflow crowd. Please remember if you park on one of the side streets do not block or encroach upon the driveways of our neighbors.

The Trustees have attempted to provide adequate spaces for handicapped parking. Please do not park in these spots without the proper documentation.

Finally, we know there will be times when cars are uncooperative and they breakdown. If you need to leave your car in the lot overnight because of a breakdown, or if you leave your vehicle here to participate on a weekend or week-long mission trip, please try to notify the Trinity office staff. Parking here is fine in those situations, we just need to make sure that we have clear access to our dumpsters, especially on pick up days, plus we can keep an eye out for your vehicle.

And, one more finally, from September thru May our Preschool is in session. Our Preschool leaders have crafted out an arrival and departure plan that works very well. Please be aware of the increased traffic at 9 AM and 12 noon. Lots of little ones are in motion at those times.
