Pastor's Corner

"People, look east. The time is near of the crowning of the year. Make your house fair as you are able, trim the hearth and set the table. People, look east and sing today; Love, the Guest, is on the way." (People, Look East, UM Book of Hymns #202, verse 1)

Let's talk about Advent. Yes, I know it may seem a bit early, but it's important. Advent 2020 will be unlike any other. What is abundantly clear as we move toward our "Holiday Season" is that the Covid-19 pandemic is getting worse, not better. This will make the season more difficult as we try to responsibly social distance. And without careful thought and intention it could make the season, well...sad. But it doesn't *have* to be that way.

Advent, our season of spiritual preparation for Christmas, can and should be a time of renewal. The Church Staff and I have been planning for Advent for months, once it became clear that this virus wasn't going away soon. In a time such as this we determined two goals for our church in Advent.

- 1. Sanctify the home. As we worship, attend school, conduct gatherings *et al* from our homes, our goal is to make our homes places *of worship*, rather than places where we just watch worship. Therefore we hope to provide you with opportunities to participate at home with actions and tangible items. Perhaps this may help create some new traditions that will outlast these troubled times.
- 2. **Bring us together as we are separated.** It's easy to feel isolated. It's easy to lose our connection. Therefore we want to encourage and spur your creativity, to help you get closer connected. I hope that classes, circles, choirs, covenant groups and every other category of fellowship will take up the challenge with some of the possibilities that we'll suggest.

Our theme this year is "People, Look East" taken from the traditional French carol, # 202 in our hymnal. (More on that later...I don't want to steal my own thunder!) But for now let me just mention three quick things:

- If you don't have an Advent Wreath in your home, you should. Get one. That can be as simple as gathering four purple or blue candles (okay, three colored and one pink if you're a purist) and a white candle for the center. Or, simply search "advent wreath" on your computer browser or search engine. There are a million available! Do this now.
- We are going to be providing you an "Advent Kit". These are some items for you to help in what I've described above. Yes, it's been an investment for the church, but a wise one. If you take it to heart it will be well worth it!
- These kits can be picked up at the church starting November 16. Or, you can pick them up at a (weather permitting) **Outdoor Giving of Thanks Service** on the church grounds **Sunday, November 22** at 3:00 PM. This service should last about 30 minutes and will include all our safety protocols. Those people who are homebound, live out-of-area or who request it will have the kit mailed to you.

Jesus wasn't born into a world that was fat, happy and content. God came into a world that was struggling, troubled and in need. It's time to start preparing. He can't get here a moment too soon.





What's Happening in Trinity KIDS Ministry?

There are three components to our weekly kids ministry experience this fall!

- 1. Kids Church Online Video: To give families more flexibility, we are releasing a 20-30 minute Kids Church video each week! Each video is available to watch on Sunday morning at 8am (but will also be available for families to watch anytime during the week). The video includes worship songs, games, bible story, Big Idea, Grow TV video with Carll and Kassie, and other components, similar to what we do at Kids Church when we are together in person.
- 2. Parent Guide: Each week there is a guide for parents to use after their kids watch the weekly video. The guide has three activities for families to do together: discussion, activity/craft (any materials needed would be ones you likely have at home), and memory verse activity.
- 3. **Kids Ministry Zoom Call:** There is a Zoom call on Sunday mornings at 9:30am. This gives kids the opportunity to stay connected to their church family during this time of social distancing.

Parents receive an email each Sunday morning at 8am with all of the links to access the Kids Church Online video, Parent Guide, and Zoom Call.

What's the Game Plan?

We have released rehearsal videos each week and will be asking parents to film their kids singing the two songs from our videos and submitting the videos online. We will release a video showing parents the recording process and ask them to submit the videos by Thanksgiving. The remaining songs in our pageant will be sing-along songs that kids will sing at home as they watch the pageant.

This November and December, we have the opportunity to continue to support these lifeline organizations.

Let's start with Thanksgiving and the food pantries at two United Methodist Churches: Welborne and Sherbourne.

Along with continuing to receive food donations for Thanksgiving, **Welborne** is requesting \$10.00 gift cards. These cards will be distributed to the families they serve. Welborne serves a very diverse community via the food pantry. If possible, the gift cards should come from Walmart. Lots of the families they serve have easier access to Walmart. Deadline for getting your gift card donation to Trinity is Monday, November 16.

The leadership for the food pantry at **Sherbourne** is going to put together a Thanksgiving bag/box for the families they serve. Here are the items for the Thanksgiving bags:

Canned yams, corn, green beans, peas, instant mashed potatoes, canned cranberry sauce, gravy, stuffing, tea bags, coffee, sugar, flour.

Deadline for these **Sherbourne** Thanksgiving bags/boxes is Friday, November 20. Please, for this special collection double bag or use a box, and if possible avoid glass containers.

Since 1942, the **Henrico County Christmas Mother** program has worked to provide for families. This year, there will be no material donations or collections. The Henrico Christmas Mother is accepting financial donations. In turn, families who qualify for participation will receive a monetary amount to be used for food and gifts in their home.
