"The voice of one crying out in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'" Luke 3:4

If I am right you are receiving this edition of the *Window* either at the very end of November or the beginning of December. The "holiday season" is upon us again. This one will be a little different: COVID restrictions (but much improved over last year!), supply chain problems that complicate everything, inflation, possible travel problems.

What will your December look like? Even in the midst of traditions we cherish it could very easily be full of stress, demands, busyness and obligations of cultural norms. (Have you ever experienced the feeling of relief when the holidays are over?) But in this spiritual wilderness there is a voice crying, "Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight." That is to say that there is another way.

Take a deep breath. Slow down, and commit yourself to a holy and intentional Advent. Here are some simple tips:

Use our Advent Devotion daily. Nothing could be easier. Couple it with a prayer. Those few moments can make a huge difference in your day.

Look for signs of God every day. It may be in the beauty of creation. It may be in the face or voice of a loving person. It may be in a situation. It might come from reading your Bible. To see God, you have to be open and looking for God.

Share with those in need. Nothing can soften our hard hearts quicker. In this time of inflation, the food bags are more important than ever. Our Advent offering supports UMFS (United Methodist Family Services), how worthy is this agency serving the most vulnerable children in Virginia.

The holiday season is upon us again. But so is the holy season of Advent. What will your December look like?

Reconnect with Prayer

"...and he (Jesus) spent the night in prayer to God. " Luke 6:12)

Jesus often withdrew himself to pray. It was on the mountain and in the desert where he could be alone or together to pray to God. It was also in the morning and the evening. Even though Jesus is the son of God, he needed to have a time of prayer because prayer is a fellowship with God and a time to commune with God and discern what God is calling him to do. It was a rhythm, a pattern, and a lifestyle of Jesus. The Bible clearly describes that prayer has a significant role in Jesus' life and ministry.

How much do we need prayer in our lives? How does it play its role in your life? Do you have a prayer in your life? Does our church have a prayer?

We claim to be Christians but often time we let our rationality and logic precede prayer. Prayer is not about asking for wishes, but it is a time to tune our hearts and minds to God because Jesus prayed the most powerful prayer, "Yet, not my will but yours be done." (Luke 22:42)

In Advent, Trinity invites you to join in prayer to reconnect to God and one another. The chapel will be open for the solitude of prayer and meditation on **December 3, 10, and 17** from 7:00 AM to 6:00 PM. You can leave your prayer requests in the chapel. Also, pastor Hung Su Lim will offer communion at noon. Advent is a time of preparation for "arrival." Let us prepare our hearts and minds to receive the king. Let us be one body of Christ in love, peace, and joy through prayer.

Blue Christmas Service, A Service of Hope and Healing


We want to invite those of you


Advent Devotional



Calendar Year-end Contributions

IRS Code 10170A-1(b) states that only funds received by December 31, 2021 **or**

postmarked by December 31, 2021 may be counted as 2021 contributions. The date of receipt or the postmark is the key to determining the year of receipt. Thus, if someone hand carries a check to the church on January 3, 2022 that is dated December 31, 2021 it is a **2022** gift according to IRS regulations. But, if a check arrives by mail at the church on January 3, 2022 and it is postmarked December 31, 2021 and the check is dated December 31, 2021 or before, it is a **2021** gift.

Winter Weather Decisions

Decisions for closing our building related to winter weather are tricky. Basically, we follow the closing announcements from Henrico County Public Schools. For example, if schools close early or

are on a delayed opening, Trinity's opening and closing times are adjusted. If Henrico schools are closed, Trinity will be closed, and this would include all day and evening events. Our ability to re-open the building after a winter weather event depends upon how quickly we can clear our sidewalks and parking lots. If we can safely get people on to our grounds and into our building, then Trinity might return to normal operations quicker than the school system. Community Prayer Breakfast at St. Andrew's UMC



Christmas Recycling: Dos and Don'ts

At Christmas, recycling is as important as ever as we deal with some seasonal items that can be confusing. Here are some tips:

- Christmas cards & envelopes: if either the card or envelope has glitter, embellishments or a metallic finish, it can't be recycled. If it's all plain paper, recycle.
- Wrapping paper: glitter, metallic or foil finishes make wrapping paper non-recyclable. If you're unsure (e.g., the wrapping paper looks glossy but not metallic), perform the scrunch test; if it stays in a ball when scrunched, it can be recycled. Do not recycle shiny ribbons & bows.
- Christmas food packaging: a lot can be recycled but not all in the same place.
 - *Clean clear plastic packaging can be recycled with your plastic grocery bags at many grocery stores. Black plastic cannot be recycled.
 - *Clean foam trays, cups & egg cartons can be recycled at Publix stores.
 - *Glass bottles and jars can be recycled keep the lids on to make sorting easier.
 - *Pizza boxes & food-contaminated items cannot be recycled.
- Christmas lights recycling: hardware stores such as Lowe's & Home Depot accept strings of Christmas lights for recycling on a seasonal basis. Call the store near you to check when it takes these.
- Broken glass ornaments: glass ornaments are not recyclable. Wrap the broken bits in a bag or bubble wrap & put in general waste.
- Delivery & gift boxes: Break these down to take up less room & recycle.

Keep the planet in mind when selecting gifts. Choosing experiences over material goods – concert tickets, a special night out – not only reduces waste but makes lasting memories!
