On that first Easter Sunday the women went before dawn to the tomb. Their intent was to anoint the body of Jesus. There was no time for the ritual washing and anointing after the crucifixion. There was haste to place his body in the tomb before the beginning of the Jewish sabbath. This belated act on the part of the women was a final act of love, devotion and fealty. But it was also a bit counter-intuitive, don't you think? Their Master had been executed. Their hopes had been dashed. Their movement had been crushed. A more predictable response would have been shock, disillusionment and despair. Who would have blamed them had their response been, "Oh, what's the point? What difference will it make now?" Who would have chastised them had their

On that first Easter, the response of the women was a defiant and stubborn faith. Things had not gone their way (yet!). They did not get what they expected. They did not get what they wanted. They were not in control. And yet...and yet they were faithful. As we approach the great remembrance of the passion, death and resurrection of Christ I invite you to ponder the response of the women and in that light consider that of your own. Their Sunday began in mourning and ended in joy.

For many years, the generous hearts of the Trinity congregation have financially sustained LEMO. These acts of financial kindness have supported nonprofits in our city, state, country, and world.



Weekly Food Drive

During the pandemic, the Trinity congregation has made a significant difference in the lives of the people who live within the zip codes of the Belmont, Sherbourne, and Welborne food pantries. The staff members and volunteers from these three Methodist churches work diligently every week to stock shelves, make purchases of

fresh food and meats, and coordinate organized and orderly distributions.

Recently, each food pantry has experienced an increase in the number of people they serve. Directors believe a number of factors impact an unexpected surge, but the increased price in gasoline is certainly putting families in difficult situations—food or fuel.

As we move into the spring months, if you have not participated in dropping off food in Trinity Hall on Fridays, we encourage you to give it a try. Weekly updates are given each week in the Connection. This includes a listing of the food items that are needed at each pantry, a summary report from the previous week's donations, and a gentle reminder to double bag or box all grocery items, try not to purchase food packaged in glass containers, and consider making your weekly purchase at the Market at 25th.

Update from Trustees

Currently, the Trustees and a team of volunteers are working on the

restoration of the Parlor. A ceiling leak from an HVAC system pipe failure created challenges with the existing ceiling and carpet. In the process of working with the damaged ceiling and carpet, it became clear that we had an opportunity to make some much needed improvements to this room.

The Trustees have approved contracts for new lighting, ceiling, flooring, and repainting. Under consideration are the replacement of the doors and furniture upgrades. Part of the goal is to make the parlor more user friendly for a variety of church activities.

In the February Window, the Trustees presented preliminary information about the Phase I renovation project. This extensive renovation would have made significant and needed HVAC improvements to the Preschool/Education wing and a section of the building that stretches from the Sanctuary balcony to the second floor of the Preschool/Education wing. The scope of the project also included restrooms, ceilings, flooring, windows, doors, and painting.

At March meetings of the Finance Committee and the Church Council, this project was temporarily tabled. Cost, timing, and a new pastor coming on board were part of the discussion in pausing the project.

The Trustees are committed to this project, and they respect the decision made by the Finance Committee and Church Council. During this pause, Jim Crowder or Bill Pike are willing to take Sunday school classes, small groups, circles, and individuals on a tour of the area to be renovated. 

WEEK 3


Isaiah 53:6, John 19:28-30
