



Community Conversations start at **7 PM** in the Sanctuary. Members from our congregation can watch live in the Sanctuary or watch the livestream feed in your home.



Update from Trustees

In the fall of 2021, a leak in one of our HVAC units damaged the

ceiling in the Parlor. The Trustees used this intrusion to chart a course of improvement for the parlor. A new ceiling, lighting, flooring, and painting are in the process of being initiated and completed. Additionally, the Trustees want to improve the functionality of the room. Yes, the room will still be used to assist families for funerals and weddings, but it will also be available for meetings and small receptions. This means the furniture in the room will depart from its traditional look.

If over the years, your family donated a couch, two wing chairs, an assortment of lamps and tables, chandelier, corner cabinet, and a grandfather clock, the Trustees want to give you the opportunity to reclaim these items for your family. Pictures of the pieces are on the next page. Those pieces will be on display in the Chapel for pickup until May 15. After this date, the remaining pieces will be donated to a local nonprofit. 



Show How You Value God's Creation Act Today!

- 1. **DITCH THE GLITTER:** Glitter is fun, but it is still plastic that goes down the drain and out into our waterways. In 2018 scientists found the highest concentration ever of microplastics on the ocean floor. Check your make -up (added sparkle may come from microplastics) as well as greeting cards and wrap which often sparkle with glitter.
- 2. **BE FOOD SMART:** In the USA we throw away 30-40% of our food supply each year—219 pounds per person every year. Think about what people really eat in your house and buy only enough fresh products for a few days. If there is old fruit with seeds, throw it outside for the birds and squirrels. Start composting on a small scale and then expand over time.
- 3. EMBRACE EARTH-FRIENDLY FASHION: In 1918 1.3 million tons of textiles ended up in land-fills. More manufacturers are offering products made with reused or earth friendly materials. Try these products or simply recycle your family's own clothing or household textiles to use them longer.
- 4. **TRY COMPOSTING:** Food and yard waste make up more than 30% of what we throw away. Use a small composting container in the kitchen for table scraps and fabric refuse. Dump the refuse in your yard in a small space where it can decompose and then be added to flower beds to enrich the soil.
- 5. **QUIT THE PLASTIC HABIT:** Americans breathe or eat about 2000 particles of plastic a week, about the weight of a credit card. Work to eliminate a few plastic containers in your house. Buy products in reusable glass or meal containers rather than plastic ones. Eliminate single use plastic items such as plastic bags. Scientists estimate that the amount of plastic in the oceans will triple within 20 years if things don't change.
