⁷ Remember your leaders who spoke God's word to you. Imitate their faith as you consider the way their lives turned out. ⁸ Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever! Hebrews 13:7-8

Mattaponi Healing Eagle Clinic

It is that time of year for our annual campaign to help support the Mattaponi Eagle Healing Clinic. Last year the congregation of Trinity Methodist Church contributed over \$5,000 to help purchase supplies that included both medical supplies, vaccinations and personal hygiene items (including children's diapers) for the Mattaponi Eagle Healing Clinic. These contributions helped sustain services to native Americas of the Mattaponi, Upper Mattaponi, Rappahannock, Pamunkey and Chickahominy tribes in Eastern and Central Virginia. Diane Garrison who is the coordinator of Indian affairs was extremely thankful for our support particularly during these difficult times.

This year Diane is again asking for monetary donations because she is short of staff and the volunteers needed to handle the logistics of storage and distribution of medical and other supplies. The Eagle Clinic has made an arrangements with a local Mechanicsville drug store program that provides medical supplies, including prescriptions, baby formula and children's diapers on a more targeted and effective manner.

The Healing Eagle Clinic still has doctors and nurses administer patient care on an as needed basis. Your contributions will help support these efforts by providing the necessary medical supplies.

Apple Angel Tree 2022

The Apple Angel Tree tradition continues for the 2022-23 school year!

Apples for supplies for the Teachers of Oak Grove-Bellemeade Elementary School will be "ripe for picking" this month. We want all of Trinity to have the opportunity to participate in this project, so we have split the applies into **in-person apples** and **digital apples**.

In-Person Apples

If you worship in person at Trinity or are able to come to Trinity, we invite you to choose an in-person apple from the display boards in the Welcome Center at the church.

Digital Apples

If you are a member of our virtual congregation or are unable to get to Trinity in person, we hope you will select a digital apple.

Delivering the Supplies

If bringing the items to Trinity, please double bag them in paper bags with handles. Attach your apple or a list of items and grade level to the outside of the bag. Deliver to the rear of Trinity Hall by Sunday, August 21.

If having the items shipped, please have them delivered to Trinity UMC, 903 Forest Ave., Richmond, VA 23229 and marked "Oak Grove Supplies." Items should be delivered by Friday, August 19.

Financial Donations

If you would prefer to make a financial donation to the Apple Angel Tree, you can do this via check (memo "Oak Grove Apple Tree") or via ACS (choose "Back to School Supplies").

What is the Apple Angel Tree?

Trinity has partnered with Oak Grove-Bellemeade Elementary School through the city-wide Micah Initiative for over 15 years. One of our most popular projects each year has been to provide much-needed school supplies. Over 50 Trinity families participate in this effort each year.

During the Spring, we meet with the lead teachers for all grade levels at the school and come up with a list of items the teachers would like to receive for their classrooms. There are about 130 apples that can be "picked from our tree" for the upcoming school year.

New Shoes for Back to School

New Shoes for Back to School is a ministry carried out by a group called the Metropolitan Partnership of Churches/ Synagogue. This year, the coalition is made of 10 churches (including Trinity) plus one synagogue. The group provides new shoes to K-12 schoolchildren in underserved communities in the metro Richmond area. This is the fifth year that Trinity has been a part of this ministry.

The New Shoes Ministry is continuing with its "Plan B" that has been so successful during the COVID-19 pandemic. Instead of one distribution day open to the public, the organizers have reached out directly to area Title 1 schools. Each church/synagogue will again provide shoes directly to their assigned schools during the first half of September.

There are three ways you can help:

- 1. **Stay tuned for more details,** including sizes and numbers of shoes needed. You can purchase and drop them by the Welcome Center or you can order shoes online from your favorite store and have them delivered to Trinity.
- 2. **Consider making a financial gift.** This allows organizers to be efficient in purchasing shoes (often they are needed for older students). Please specify "New Shoes Ministry" with your donation.
- 3. **Keep the New Shoes for Back to School Ministry in your prayers.** The lead organizer is Third Street Bethel A.M.E., a church founded circa 1850 that shares a history with Trinity UMC. This is a great way to recognize and continue that important relationship.

Building a platform for church communication is a long, tedious process. It also requires the communication specialist to be able to respond to new trends that often spring up overnight.

For Trinity, Kim has done all of those important communication pieces. She has positioned us to keep moving forward. We thank Kim for her behind the scenes leadership, and wish her best of luck as she takes on a full-time role for a church in Haymarket as their communication specialist.
