Because of this love, we can choose to live with increasing fullness into the attitude of trusting God with our lives. Let us be attentive to the prompting of the Holy Spirit and make this about God's time, not ours. Let this be God's season.

Jesus shows us the truth. God is with us. We are not alone. We have the Holy Spirit and we have each other. That's something special. Together, we can shine Jesus' light into a broken, fearful, hurting world. Thanks be to God.

Dillard Forum

The 2022 Dillard Forum is scheduled for **November 6-7** with Dr. Norbert Wilson from Duke Divinity School.

The overall theme of the lectures will center on the seeking justice in food ministries, we are still working out the specific titles. The first lecture will be about the hunger in America broadly, and the second lecture will focus on ways that churches work to address the challenge.

Professor Wilson's research touches on several food issues, such as access, choice, and food waste. He continues to work on food safety and quality issues in international trade and domestic food systems. Wilson is an ordained vocational deacon in the Episcopal Church USA. His work is moving to explore equity in food access.

New Shoes for Back to School

New Shoes for Back to School is a ministry by a group called the Metropolitan Partnership of Churches/ Synagogue. This year, the coalition includes 10 churches (including Trinity) plus one synagogue. The group provides new shoes to K-12 Title 1 schoolchildren in under-served communities in the metro Richmond area. This is Trinity's sixth year as a part of this ministry.

The organizers have reached out directly to the schools and each church/synagogue will again provide 50 pairs of shoes directly to their assigned schools by the end of August. Trinity's two schools are Harvie Elementary School and Barack Obama Elementary School.

This year, we are asking for cash donations only. Through a local retailer, we have connected with a shoe distributor and can negotiate a reduced price to purchase durable, high-quality shoes.

Mattaponi Healing Eagle Clinic

It is that time of year for our annual campaign to help support the Mattaponi Eagle Healing Clinic. Last year the congregation of Trinity Methodist Church contributed over \$5,000 to help purchase supplies that included both medical supplies, vaccinations and personal hygiene items (including children's diapers) for the Mattaponi Eagle Healing Clinic. These contributions helped sustain services to native Americas of the Mattaponi, Upper Mattaponi, Rappahannock, Pamunkey and Chickahominy tribes in Eastern and Central Virginia. Diane Garrison who is the coordinator of Indian affairs was extremely thankful for our support particularly during these difficult times.

This year Diane is again asking for monetary donations because she is short of staff and the volunteers needed to handle the logistics of storage and distribution of medical and other supplies. The Eagle Clinic has made an arrangements with a local Mechanicsville drug store program that provides medical supplies, including prescriptions, baby formula and children's diapers on a more targeted and effective manner.

The Healing Eagle Clinic still has doctors and nurses administer patient care on an as needed basis. Your contributions will help support these efforts by providing the necessary medical supplies.

If having the items shipped, please have them delivered to Trinity UMC, 903 Forest Ave., Richmond, VA 23229 and marked "Oak Grove Supplies." Items should be delivered by Friday, August 19.

Financial Donations

If you would prefer to make a financial donation to the Apple Angel Tree, you can do this via check (memo "Oak Grove Apple Tree") or via ACS (choose "Back to School Supplies").

What is the Apple Angel Tree?

Trinity has partnered with Oak Grove-Bellemeade Elementary School through the city-wide Micah Initiative for over 15 years. One of our most popular projects each year has been to provide much-needed school supplies. Over 50 Trinity families participate in this effort each year.

During the Spring, we meet with the lead teachers for all grade levels at the school and come up with a list of items the teachers would like to receive for their classrooms. There are about 130 apples that can be "picked from our tree" for the upcoming school year.
