Work Day at Historic Woodland Cemetery



What's Happening in Trinity KIDS Ministry?



We now have a new check-in system for Trinity Kids located in the Welcome Center! We will be checking kids into Kids Worship (9am), elementary and preschool classes (10am), and nursery (9am, 10am, & 11am).

If you haven't already created your free account, please do so by going to go.kidcheck.com and selecting "Create Your KidCheck Account". Or download the KidCheck Mobile App from the App Store or Google Play Store to create, manage, and update your account right on your mobile device.



Have you been to the 9am service recently? We have started to offer Kids Worship for our pre-k through 2nd graders during the sermon. After the Kids Moment, Jen takes this age group of kids out of the service for activities geared towards their learning level while the rest of the congregation hears the sermon being preached. Kids return to the service after the sermon.

** This change to our schedule allows kids to be in the worship service for key moments of worship and prayer while also allowing them to leave for activities geared towards their age group during the sermon. **

What if my kid is younger than pre-K?

* The nursery is open for kids three and under.

What if my kid is older than 2nd grade?

* Kids older than 2nd grade remain in the worship service for the entire service. Jen has special resources for this age group to use during the service to help them engage in worship; they are located near the worship bags.

What if I want my kid to remain in the service with me?

* Kids are always welcome to stay in the service for the entire time!


Harvest Day Tuesday, November 8
