Pastor's Corner

Brothers and sisters, we ask you to respect those who are working with you, leading you, and instructing you. ¹³ Think of them highly with love because of their work. Live in peace with each other. ¹⁴ Brothers and sisters, we urge you to warn those who are disorderly. Comfort the discouraged. Help the weak. Be patient with everyone. ¹⁵ Make sure no one repays a wrong with a wrong, but always pursue the good for each other and everyone else. ¹⁶ Rejoice always. ¹⁷ Pray continually. ¹⁸ Give thanks in every situation because this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus. ¹⁹ Don't suppress the Spirit. ²⁰ Don't brush off Spirit-inspired messages, ²¹ but examine everything carefully and hang on to what is good. ²² Avoid every kind of evil. ²³ Now, may the God of peace himself cause you to be completely dedicated to him; and may your spirit, soul, and body be kept intact and blameless at our Lord Jesus Christ's coming. ²⁴ The one who is calling you is faithful and will do this. *1 Thessalonians 5:12-24*

"Give thanks in every situation because this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." This is a tough word. There are plenty of things in our lives that we do not feel like giving thanks for. Unfortunately, this has been often misinterpreted to mean all things come from God. That's not quite right either. God does, indeed, have a plan, but humans are not consistent in following it. Our choices, and the choices of others, apart from God cause most of the problems. What I believe Paul is saying to the church is that even though the situation may not be God's will, the giving thanks in the midst of it is. We are able to give thanks because we know the whole story. Grace and salvation has already been given. The battle is already won. Therefore, no matter what happens, we are able to give thanks to God.

As we journey through the month of Thanksgiving, let us keep this in mind. God wants us to be able to give thanks. God wants us to be able to discern truth. God wants us to be able to help each other in this difficult life together. Our family and community Thanksgiving celebrations can be part of this, if we make it intentional. More than just a national celebration, it becomes a celebration of faith.

Many years ago, in my first church, we hosted a vocal group from St. Petersburg, Russia at Thanksgiving time. We had a great concert on Thanksgiving eve followed by a worship service in which they helped provide music. On Thanksgiving Day, we were able to take the whole group with us to celebrate Thanksgiving with my family. They had never experienced something quite like that. We were thrilled to be able to share this with them, and we hope that it gave them a sense of hope.

I think that's the heart of the message in 1 Thessalonians. Pray. Give thanks. Share. Be Christ to those around you from wherever they are from. This is how we make a difference. This is how we change hearts. This is how we help shift from a spirit of scarcity fueled by panic to a spirit of generosity fueled by thanksgiving. We are God's people. Let us give thanks.

Building Security and the Trinity Hall Kitchen

Here is a refresher about building access and using the Trinity Hall Kitchen. Please note that our building has systems in place for fire and security when our building is closed at the end of each day. The building is open Monday-Friday by 8 AM. On Monday-Thursday, the close time is 8:30 PM. For Friday, the building is closed and alarmed by 7 PM. An after normal hours a breach in the system notifies our security company and designated Trinity personnel are contacted.

Per recommendations from the Henrico Police Department, during a regular day, we keep all perimeter doors to the building locked. We do this in cooperation with the Trinity Preschool. If you are coming to the church to drop something off, please use the entryway for the Church Office on the playground side of the building. This door is equipped with a camera and a system for you to be allowed entry once Trinity personnel have identified you.

There are exceptions to all of the doors being secured. We make different arrangements for a class, a community class, a church/community event, and funerals. Unless a scheduled event is taking place, the building is normally closed on Saturdays.

Prior to the pandemic all catering positions related to the Trinity Hall Kitchen were eliminated. During the pandemic, the kitchen was not used.

The basic rule for the kitchen is this: if you as an individual or a group uses the kitchen you/the group are responsible for cleaning the kitchen. Cleaning the kitchen means the following: emptying trash and replacing trash bags, washing all items that were used for preparing food and consuming a meal, sweeping and mopping the floor, cleaning counter tops, sink basins, and returning utensils to the proper areas of storage. The kitchen is stocked with a commercial grade coffee maker, two freezers, two refrigerators, dishwasher, garbage disposal, two gas fired convection ovens, a gas range and oven, plus a hood system with fire suppression equipment.

Before using the kitchen, if you or your group would like instruction on how to use the equipment, please notify, Ronnie Johnson, our head building caretaker. He can be reached by calling the church office 804-288-6056.
