Pastor's Corner

When Elizabeth was six months pregnant, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a city in Galilee, to a virgin who was engaged to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David's house. The virgin's name was Mary. When the angel came to her, he said, "Rejoice, favored one! The Lord is with you!" She was confused by these words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. Luke 1:26-29

I imagine if we experienced an angel, our response might be similar to Mary's: confused and wondering. How often does God ask us to do things that might confuse us? As for me, I am often left wondering. We know how this story goes. The angel, God's very messenger, gives Mary just enough information that she is able to accept what is coming. As a matter of fact, the prose from Mary we have recorded in Luke 1:46-55 is one of the most beautiful passages in all of Scripture, beginning with "With all my heart I glorify the Lord! In the depths of who I am I rejoice in God my Savior. He has looked with favor on the low status of his servant. Look! From now on, everyone will consider me highly favored because the mighty one has done great things for me."

How amazing is this! God asks a big ask and Mary's response is "the mighty one has done great things for me." She is excited to live out God's plan for her life. She chooses to follow. She chooses, not knowing all that choosing will mean. This choice requires complete trust in God.

My hope for us, beginning this holiday season, is that we learn to trust more and say yes to God's plans even when we don't know how it will all work out. Let our exclamation every day be like that of Mary, especially as we become immersed in this season of celebration. The Lord has done mighty things... for me... for you... for us. I believe we can celebrate God's work every day because there is much to celebrate. The more we can proclaim God's work in our lives in ways the world sees, the more others want to join us in that celebration.

Even as we wonder what God has for us and are even confused by God's plans, let us celebrate the mighty things God has done, is doing, and has yet to do. Thanks be to God.




Monday Morning Bible Study

Calendar Year-end Contributions

IRS Code 10170A-1(b) states that only funds received by December 31, 2022 or postmarked by December 31, 2022 may be counted as 2022 contributions. The date of receipt or the postmark is the key to determining the year of receipt. Thus, if someone hand carries a check to the church on January 3, 2023 that is dated December 31, 2022 it is a 2023 gift according to IRS regulations. But, if a check arrives by mail at the church on January 3, 2023 and it is postmarked December 31, 2022 and the check is dated December 31, 2022 or before, it is a 2022 gift.

Winter Weather Decisions

Decisions for closing our building related to winter weather are tricky. Basically, we follow the closing announcements from Henrico County Public Schools. For example, if schools close early or are on a

delayed opening, Trinity's opening and closing times are adjusted. If Henrico schools are closed, Trinity will be closed, and this would include all day and evening events. Our ability to re-open the building after a winter weather event depends upon how quickly we can clear our sidewalks and parking lots. If we can safely get people on to our grounds and into our building, then Trinity might return to normal operations quicker than the school system.
