
8:00 PM Traditional service (also online)

Update from Trinity's Healthy Church Team

Over the last few weeks, public health officials have noted an uptick in cases of COVID-19, seasonal flu, and RSV, both nationally and regionally.

The Trinity Healthy Church Team continues to monitor the data from these cases and recommendations from our public health leaders. At this time, our Healthy Church Team is not recommending any significant changes to our current masking policy.

In order to provide a safe space for the more health-vulnerable, we will continue to designate the balcony as the seating area in the Sanctuary where wearing a mask is required. We appreciate your cooperation in complying with this request.



Persons interested in helping with deliveries can also let Bonnie and Judy know.



Gifts of Stock

Many members choose to make donations of stock as a tax-deductible contribution to Trinity. The Virginia United Methodist Foundation provides this brokerage service to churches free of charge. While our current broker has served us faithfully for many years, this is an offer we feel we can't pass up. As always, please let the Financial Administrator know when you have initiated a stock gift so we can be looking for the check and can match the check with the donor.

Calendar Year-end Contributions

IRS Code 10170A-1(b) states that only funds received by December 31, 2022 or postmarked by December 31, 2022 may be counted as 2022 contributions. The date of receipt or the postmark is the key to determining the year of receipt. Thus, if someone hand carries a check to the church on January 3, 2023 that is dated December 31, 2022 it is a 2023 gift according to IRS regulations. But, if a check arrives by mail at the church on January 3, 2023 and it is postmarked December 31, 2022 and the check is dated December 31, 2022 or before, it is a 2022 gift.

Winter Weather Decisions



Decisions for closing our building related to winter weather are tricky. Basically, we follow the closing announcements from Henrico County Public Schools. For example, if schools close early or are on a de-

layed opening, Trinity's opening and closing times are adjusted. If Henrico schools are closed, Trinity will be closed, and this would include all day and evening events. Our ability to re-open the building after a winter weather event depends upon how quickly we can clear our sidewalks and parking lots. If we can safely get people on to our grounds and into our building, then Trinity might return to normal operations quicker than the school system. Summer 2023 Mission Trip

For our 2023 summer mission trip, we're heading to Hinton Rural Life Center, in Hayesville, NC. This is a

multi-generational trip designed to include our students as well as families and individuals who want to come along.

Hinton is a retreat center, but also a mission agency, with year-round opportunities for individual volunteers and mission teams to work with us and "alongside" our neighbors in Safe and Healthy Home Repair ministry. Other service options include our firewood ministry and Ervin Sanctuary Gardens & Trails. With its outreach focus, Hinton seeks to enhance the long-term quality of life in our rural area. And, Hinton guests "pay it forward," as our lodging revenues help support our community outreach programs.

Hinton is a United Methodist agency, and we welcome all — all individuals, all faith traditions, and non-faith-based groups seeking to meet, retreat, and serve in a spirit of acceptance and mutual respect.
